REGISTRATION PROFILE

- Top participating states were TX, AZ and OH. All 50 states (plus DC) represented.
- 70% were in the school division, 18% in the drop-off division, 9% in the district division, and 3% in the open division.
- 88% were public schools, 9% were private schools, and 2% were charter schools.
- 52% were elementary, 16% were middle and 19% were high schools.
- 28% of schools were in a suburban area, 16% in rural, 33% in urban and 7% in mix.
- 46% of schools were registered by their community recycling coordinator.

IMPACT METRICS

- There was a 9% increase in the perception of "good" or "robust" programs, and a 7% decrease in programs saying they needed improvement at the end of the competition.
- 3.7% use the competition to start a recycling program.
- A majority said they saw "some" or "significant" increase in recycling tonnage during the competition.
- There were 82,439,357 page views, with 7,609,406 unique visitors to the website.







- 71% of recycled commodities is paper and cardboard
- Cartons increased from 32,667in 2012 to 66,257 pounds in 2013(51% increase) to make up 5% of the source-separated stream.

RESULTS AND WINNERS

- 1st place in the national school category went to Foothill Elementary School in Pittsburg, CA. Their pounds per capita rate was 156. They win \$4700 in cash and prizes.
- 1st place in the national community category went to York Adventist Christian School in York, Pennsylvania. Their pounds per capita rate was 939. They win \$1,000 in cash.
- The school that improved the most over last year is Egg Harbor Township High School in Egg Harbor, New Jersey. They went from .25 lb/capita to 37 lbs/capita. They win \$1,000 in store credit to purchase more recycling bins from Busch Systems.
- The Nestle Employee Engagement School that collected the most material per capita is Arnold J Tyler School in New Lenox, Illinois. They collected 32 lbs/capita. They will win \$1,000 from Nestle Waters North America.
- The school that collected the most milk and juice cartons is Kodak Park School #41 in Rochester, New York. They collected 6.4 lbs/capita of cartons. They win \$500 from the Carton Council.

The Recycle-Bowl program is helping KAB fulfill its Clinton Global Initiative commitment.
